The University of Wyoming needed a new building to house its computer data and network facilities. Existing structures were demolished so the building could be situated along the historic Sorority Row. The treatment of the landscape along this section of Sorority Row had to respond to the larger context.

Lime Green Design prepared layout, grading and planting plans for the project. Particular attention was paid to the plaza on the south side of the building; it is a transitional space for students to go between classes. A canopy of large lacy trees provide shade over the space, while a seat wall wraps the south side of the plaza.

An important pedestrian thoroughfare connects the front of the building to Sorority Row to the north. This walkway functions as an informal break-out space for the building occupants. In addition, it provides opportunities for students to interact as they move between the academic and residential areas of the campus. Sandstone eddying spaces along one side of the walk are edged with lush plantings, and dotted with large boulders to provide for informal seating.
